### 2016–17 “Know Before You Go” Back-to-School Registration Checklist

Spartanburg District Two elementary schools and Boiling Springs Intermediate School will hold registration for the 2016–17 school year on Tuesday, July 26 (8 a.m.–noon, 1–6 p.m.). “Meet the Teacher” for elementary schools and Boiling Springs Intermediate is Wednesday, August 10 (1–6 p.m.). Registration dates at other schools vary and are listed on the Registration Schedule posted on the district website. Parents and guardians are strongly encouraged to register their child(ren) during the school’s registration time. The first day of school for students, August 15, is a full instructional day.

**What will you need to take with you to registration?** There is no one answer that applies to all, but below are some general checklists for returning and new students, followed by further details on things you need to *know before you go* for a stress-free registration:

If your child is a **continuing District Two student**, you will need

- Proof of residency (see explanation below)
- Information needed to update records (medical, contact, transportation, etc.)
- Fee payment
- Payment for options such as meals and insurance

If your child is **new to the district**, you will need

- Proof of residency
- Birth certificate
- Social Security number
- Proof of immunization
- Information needed to complete student records (medical, contact, transportation, etc.)
- Fee payment
- Payment for options such as meals and insurance

(Additionally, a discipline affidavit signed by parent/guardian is required for students **transferring from other districts**.)

#### **Proof of Residency—required annually for all students**

Proof of residency is required annually for all students, new and returning. When registering, one of the following documents **in parent/guardian name** must be presented as **verification of physical address**:

- Current utility bill (electricity, water, cable TV, natural gas, landline telephone—*not cell phone*)
- Current lease agreement
- Current tax receipt on **residence**

#### **Entrance Age (*age on September 1*)**

Students registering for kindergarten must be five years old on or before **September 1**. Students registering for first grade must be six years old on or before the cutoff date of September 1. Enrollment in 4K is limited; students are tested before admission.

## Immunizations

Documentation is required at initial enrollment and at specific grade levels per SC minimum requirements:

Vaccine	Grade	Requirements
Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis	5K–10	Four (4) doses of any combination of DTP, DT, DTP-Hib, DTaP, Td or Tdap vaccine with at least one (1) dose received on or after the fourth birthday.
	11–12	Three (3) doses of any combination of DTP, DT, DTP-Hib, DTaP, Td, or Tdap vaccine with at least one dose received on or after the fourth birthday.
Tdap Booster	7–8	One (1) dose of Tdap vaccine received on or after the 7 <sup>th</sup> birthday. (If necessary, this dose of Tdap may be included as one of the doses needed to meet the requirement for Diphtheria, Tetanus, and Pertussis noted above.)
Polio	5K–2	Three (3) doses of any combination of oral or inactivated polio vaccine with at least one (1) dose received on or after the fourth birthday.
	3–12	Three (3) doses of oral and/or inactivated polio vaccine with at least one (1) dose received on or after the fourth birthday, or four (4) doses of IPV before fourth birthday with all doses separated by at least four weeks.
Rubeola	5K–12	Two (2) doses of rubeola (measles) vaccine with both doses received on or after the first birthday and separated by at least one month.
Rubella	5K–12	One (1) doses of rubella (German measles) vaccine received on or after the first birthday.
Mumps	5K–12	One (1) dose of mumps vaccine received on or after the first birthday.
Hepatitis B	5K–12	Three (3) doses of hepatitis B vaccine.
Varicella	5K	Two (2) doses of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine received on or after the first birthday, or positive history of the disease.
	1–12	One (1) dose of varicella (chickenpox) vaccine received on or after the first birthday, or positive history of the disease.

Immunizations are available at the Health Department. If you have questions about immunization, contact your medical provider or local Health Department.

## New Students/Transfers

Students registering in the district for the first time should present a legal **birth certificate** and **certificate of immunization**. All students must meet immunization requirements for attendance. A Social Security number is requested. If students were previously enrolled in another school outside of the district or state, the receiving school will send for educational records if parents do not have them at registration.

In-district transfers to other schools may be approved for hardship situations. Transfer requests should be submitted between February 1 and April 15 for the following school year. No transfer requests will be approved once the school year has begun. Transfer applications are available on the district website at <http://www.spartanburg2.k12.sc.us/StuServices/studentervices.htm> and from the school or District Office (578-0128).

For students transferring from other school districts, a parent/guardian must sign a notarized discipline affidavit verifying that the student is not in trouble with the legal system or at the previous school.

Nonresident students who are qualified to enroll in District Two are required to pay tuition of \$3,912.

## Fees

At registration, Spartanburg District Two schools assess student instructional/activity fees to cover the cost of educational materials and supplies. In grades K-5, the fee is \$7; the fee at secondary schools is \$10. Additional fees may apply at the secondary level for courses that require specialized materials, equipment, etc.

## Meals

Several payment options are available for purchasing school meals; detailed information will be available at registration. Applications for reduced and free meals are available at registration or at any time during the year. Contact the cafeteria manager at your child's school or the district Food Service Office at 515-5150 for more information.

### **Breakfast Prices**

- Full-pay for all grades: \$234 per year/\$117 per semester/\$1.30 per day
- Reduced-price for all grades: \$54 per year/\$27 per semester/\$.30 per day

### **Lunch Prices**

- Full-pay for grades K-5: \$405 per year/\$202.50 per semester/\$2.25 per day
- Full-pay for grades 6-12: \$423 per year/\$211.50 per semester/\$2.35 per day
- Reduced-price for all grades: \$72 per year/\$36 per semester/\$.40 per day
